Project launch

Health & Social Care Moray has launched the latest stage of a project to provide new health and care facilities in Keith.

People are urged to get involved in exploring the opportunities that could be delivered from a purpose-built centre and a wider programme of work to develop a future model that responds to the health and care needs of the community and supports enhanced service provision.

Health & Social Care Moray and NHS Grampian are working to secure Scottish Government funding for the facility.

A Project Board, headed by Pam Gowans, Chief Officer of Health & Social Care Moray, will support Susan Pellegrom, Project Manager, in the preparation of the Initial Agreement (IA) needed to access funding.

The document must set out why a new facility is needed, services that could be provided, the benefits and likely costs.


It will be informed by listening to and working alongside the public, people involved in health and social care and key partners including the Third Sector.

Mrs Gowans said: "We are ambitious in our desire to form a model of health and care for this locality which is fit for the future, which improves service delivery, people's experiences of services and leads to better health and wellbeing outcomes.

"We want to come together with all stakeholders to understand their ambitions for health and care in their community and draw on their interests to plan, develop and deliver this project together."

Following an initial public meeting in the Longmore Hall, Keith, on Tuesday 23 July to launch the project, a series of service modelling workshops and engagement activities will be held to support the community to drive the design and delivery of the new health and care facility and future services.

Part of a 16-hectare development site off Keith's Banff Road South is reserved for a healthcare facility.
