Sharing aspirations

Ideas are being gathered on what a new health and care facility in Keith could offer patients.

Health & Social Care Moray and its partners have been busy engaging with the community, staff and people involved in providing services and support.

Comments and suggestions put forward are helping to build a picture of what matters to people in terms of a future service model that can meet the needs of residents in the locality.

The Keith and East Locality Project was formally launched at a public meeting in the Longmore Hall, Keith, on 23 July.

Chief Officer Pam Dudek (formerly Gowans) told the 60 people who came along that the replacement of Keith Health Centre has been a top priority for Moray and NHS Grampian for some time.

Earlier this year the project moved forward into the formal process of developing and agreeing an Initial Agreement document. This is due to go to the Scottish Government with a request for funding in May next year.

We are ambitious to continually improve service provision across the locality, Mrs Dudek told the audience.

"This is one of the most exciting things to happen in Moray for many years. We want to come up with something futuristic enough and exciting enough that the Scottish Government will want to fund it," the chief officer added.

"This will be an inclusive process.

What we come up with by the end
must be something you recognise and
which reflects your input."

The public meeting also heard from Leon Stelmach, chair of the Keith Patient Participation Group, who sits on the Project Board and GP Ben Johnson who is a member of the Working group. Both urged patients, families and staff to continue to make their voices heard throughout the process to ensure the project's success.

Next steps

Three workshops will be held to start developing a proposed service model for the Keith & East Locality. These will look at the needs of the community, the services that could meet those needs and the buildings/facilities required to support service provision.

The daytime workshops are open to everyone interested in acting together as equal partners to take shared responsibility for the development of the Initial Agreement document.

We appreciate not everyone can come to any or all of the workshops. Updates will be shared in future newsletters and on the Health & Social Care Moray website. There will be opportunities to provide input and feedback before we consult on future options.

Visitors to Keith Show visitors asked: "What do you want?

Keith Show provided a great opportunity for the Patient Participation Group from Keith Health Centre to engage with the community.

Visitors to the Lifestyle marque were invited to learn more about the project and identify what they want for the future.



Over the two days the volunteers - supported by GPs, staff from the health centre and from Health & Social Care Moray - spoke to 188 patients who took part in a survey to prioritise what they wanted to see in a new health centre.

Key issues for patients were around parking, transport links, good access in and around the building, and a reception area offering privacy. Modern consulting rooms, particularly for outpatient clinics, were a priority across all age groups.

Patients highlighted the importance of the provision of short term nursing care, end of life care and facilities for treating minor injuries.

There was strong support for bringing together a range of public sector and Third sector services on the proposed development site which is off Banff Road. These included police, ambulance, mental health, drug and alcohol and cancer services, as well as accommodation for alternative therapies.
